

Greetings to all our valued Jacaranda Golf Club neighbors.

As most you know we are undergoing a major renovation of both our East (2025) and West Courses (2026). We've undertaken this significant project for a number of reasons, including our on-going battle with a stubborn, invasive weed known as tropical signalgrass. If you've seen those large green unsightly patches on any golf course in Florida, (or any course in a "frost-free" zone), you have seen signalgrass. We are certainly not alone in this challenge.

As a result, at the end of September and the beginning of October, we will begin preparing the East course for its transformation. In the first phase our crews will apply an herbicide to eradicate all the grass. **This will leave the East Course with a very noticeable yellow tint.**

This is exactly what should be expected.

By the start of November, we will begin the "Overseed" application process which will, in a matter of weeks grow in with a new, temporary turf called ryegrass. The appearance of the course will improve almost immediately and should last through April of 2025 when we begin the actual reconstruction of the East course. That transformation will include a new more durable and signal grass-resistant turf known as Bermuda grass.

You should expect a similar process to be repeated in 2026 on the West Course.

We want to make sure you, as our neighbors, remain fully aware of these developments and are not caught off guard or left with concerns about these cosmetic changes. It's all part of the process. We pledge to keep you informed as we approach significant milestones during this renovation project and we encourage you to reach out with any questions you may have as our renovation progresses.
